Types of phrases in English

- verb phrase (VP)
- □ noun phrase (NP)
- □ adjective phrase (AdjP)
- □ adverb phrase (AdvP)
- prepositional phrase (PP) there is always a preposition

Sentence elements

- □ subject (S) [osebek]
- predicator/verb (P) [povedek]
- objects (DO, IO) [predmet]
- complements (SC, OC) [določilo]
- Adverbials / Adjuncts (A) [prislovno določilo]

They are eating.

 - Possesive pronoun (my, his, our, their)
